

The Happy Toilet Programme, developed and implemented by RAS, is supported by the **National Environment Agency (NEA)**. 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We provide a 45 minute talk to pre-school children. This talk is suitable for children between the ages of 3 to 6 years. Since 2007, RAS conducted this talk in over 150 Pre-schools and Kindergartens.

The content of this talk includes:-

- proper restroom etiquette
- good hygiene practices (hand washing, etc.)
- problems arising from dirty toilets (germs, pests, etc.)
- spreading the message home
- suggestions on how to enhance the school washrooms

The way this talk is delivered:-

- engaging pupils to encourage responses
- built in games, songs, video and quiz questions
- pupils analyse PPT storyboards and provide solutions



The Restroom Association also provides talks and workshops for parents of pre-school children.

The primary aim of these talks is to reinforce their children's' understanding of what was taught in school by making parents aware of the need to practise the same values at home.

Content of the talks and workshops include:-

- Proper restroom etiquette and hygiene practices
- Consequences of dirty toilets
- Measures and practices to ensure their child's health
- Helpful feedback opportunities
- Invitation to support the school in their initiatives like decorating the school washrooms
